REAL PROPERTY APPRAISER QUALIFICATION CRITERIA Summary of Changes

Effective May 1, 2018

The Appraiser Qualifications Board of The Appraisal Foundation establishes the *minimum* qualifications for real property appraisers in the United States. These qualifications can be found in the *Real Property Appraiser Qualification Criteria*.

To become a real property appraiser, candidates must obtain qualifying education hours, and, as applicable, obtain college-level education and experience hours, and successfully pass the National Uniform Licensing and Certification Examination. The following is a summary of changes to the Criteria effective May 1, 2018. Because state appraiser regulatory agencies are only required to adopt *minimum* AQB *Criteria*, it is <u>crucial</u> that candidates contact their state to determine if the state intends to adopt any or all of these changes, and if so, when the changes may go into effect.
